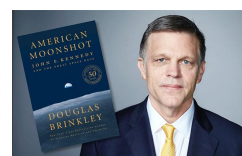

Perrysburg American Legion Post 28 Marks 100 Years

The American Legion was founded in the early months of 1919, after the end of World War I. Individual posts began organizing soon after. Perrysburg's American Legion Post was no exception. Their application date was July 10, 1919, and that's the day their post number--28--was assigned. There were 26 charter members, and the first commander was Harold Munger.

Would you like to submit your own art for inclusion in our fall exhibit?



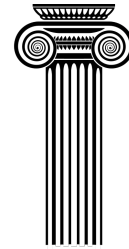

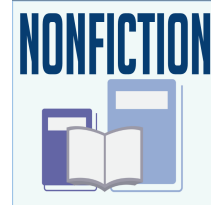
