Way Library has sponsored a Book Buddy home delivery program for over 20 years, and Mary has been an active participant since its inception. Over the years, Mary has personally selected reading and audio visual materials for homebound residents, and then made deliveries to their place of



residence. For Mary, this has been such a rewarding experience and she has especially appreciated the opportunity to read to the visually impaired. Assuming the role of a Book Buddy became so much more than home book deliveries - it was the opportunity to make wonderful new friends, engage in interesting conversation, and learn about the people that reside in Perrysburg.

Mary has always pursued a fulfilling life. In 1960, she earned the prestigious honor of becoming one of 1000 female anesthesiologists in the United States. Look Who's Cooking

Janel Haas, Way Library Director, has submitted this month's recipe for "Look Who's Cooking." This recipe is a family favorite that is served at every Easter, Thanksgiving, and Christmas holiday meal. It can be prepared a day ahead, refrigerated, and baked the next day. How simple! Hope you enjoy!



Homemade Macaroni and Cheese

2 cups of uncooked elbow macaroni
1/4 cup butter
1/4 cup flour
1/2 tsp. salt
1/4 tsp. pepper
2 cups milk
2 cups cubed Velveeta
1 cup crushed Ritz Crackers (optional)

1. Heat oven to 350° F.
2. Cook macaroni as directed on package and drain.
3. Melt butter in a 3 qt. saucepan over low heat. Stir in flour, salt and pepper. Cook over medium-low heat until mixture is smooth and bubbly. Gradually stir in milk. Heat to a boil, stirring constantly. Boil and stir 1 minute. Lower heat as needed, stir in cheese cubes and continue to cook, stirring constantly, until the cheese is melted. Once the cheese is melted, stir in the crushed crackers.
4. Add the drained macaroni and stir gently.
5. Pour in an ungreased 2-quart casserole. Bake uncovered

20-25 minutes or until bubbly.


