

Look Who's Cooking

Alisha Nolin, Way Library Youth Services Librarian, has submitted this month's recipe for "Look Who's Cooking." Alisha made these scrumptious pasties for her Family Book Club. It is easy to make and tastes like individual sized pumpkin pie. Mmmm-delicious!!



Pumpkin Pasties

Recipe for Dough

1¼ cups flour
1 Tbsp. sugar
¼ tsp. salt
½ tsp. baking powder
8 Tbsp. butter, cut into chunks
4 Tbsp. water
1 egg white for wash
(optional: use premade pie dough)

Pumpkin Filling

¾ cup granulated sugar
1 tsp. ground cinnamon
½ tsp. salt
½ tsp. ground ginger
¼ tsp. ground cloves
2 large eggs
1 can (15oz.) pumpkin puree
1 can (12 oz.) evaporated milk

1. Mix dry ingredients for the dough in a mixing bowl. Add butter to the dry ingredients, one chunk at a time. Add water and thoroughly mix until it is dough. Refrigerate the dough while preparing pumpkin filling.

2. Combine the dry ingredients for the pumpkin filling in a small bowl. Beat eggs in large bowl. Stir in pumpkin and sugar-spice mixture. Gradually stir in evaporated milk. Pour the pumpkin mixture into a small baking pan. Bake at 425° for 10-15 minutes. Lower heat to 350° and bake for 30-40 minutes until toothpick comes out clean.

3. Roll out the dough evenly, thick enough that you are able to

fold it over on itself without tearing. Cut out 4" circles (the size is really up to you!). Spoon small amounts of cooked pumpkin onto each circle and carefully fold them over, making sure not to let any pumpkin leak out. The edges should be dough touching dough. Any pumpkin in between the cracks will give you a less secure bond when you bake the pasties. Coat your pasties with an egg white wash, cut slits into the dough to vent and bake at 400° for 10-15 minutes until the tops are golden brown. Take them out and enjoy!
