Robert E. Lee Slept Here!

Did you know that Robert E. Lee once visited northern Wood County? It was in 1835 and Lee was part of the army survey crew measuring the state line between Ohio and Michigan. The original Ohio border was further south than it is today. The line angled across the Maumee River near the Rossford Boat Club. Lee spent several days working on the line, camping in the area that is now Rossford's Eagle Point Colony.

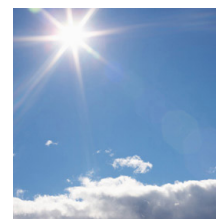
