Super Bowl Chicken Dip

2 cups Root Chicken or shredded Chicken
8 oz. cream cheese, softened

3/4 cup blue cheese dressing
1/3 cup Frank's Red Hot sauce
1-2 cups shredded cheese (depends on how cheesy you like it)

1. Combine all ingredients, except 1 cup of cheese.
2. Put in crockpot. Top with remaining cheese.
3. Cook on low for 2 hours. Serve with tortilla chips, pita chips, or bread, or just eat with a spoon!
