




October 27 - Michael Till, "Along Ohio's Historic Route 20" author to speak at Way

Route 20 was named a federal highway in 1926. As it zigzags its way through Perrysburg it transforms itself into other names such as Sandusky Street, Indiana Avenue, Louisiana Avenue and West Front Street. For the first half of the 20th century Route 20 was the most important east-west road across northern Ohio and Perrysburg was a major crossroad.
