Lorie Cowan, Way Library Page, has submitted this month's recipe for "Look Who's Cooking." Laurie said this is a simple, yet tasty recipe and has been a family favorite for years. Hope you enjoy!



### Chicken Honey Nut Stir-Fry

- 1 lb. boneless chicken breasts
- 3/4 cup orange juice
- 1/3 cup honey
- 3 Tbsp. soy sauce
- 1 Tbsp. corn starch
- 1/4 tsp. ground ginger
- 2 Tbsp. vegetable oil, divided
- 2 large carrots, diagonally cut

2 stalks celery, diagonally cut  
1/2 cup cashews or peanuts  
Hot rice

Cut chicken in thin strips and set aside. In a small bowl combine orange juice, honey, soy sauce, cornstarch, and ginger. Mix well. Heat 1 Tbsp. oil in a large skillet over medium heat. Add carrots and celery and stir-fry for 3 minutes. Remove vegetables from pan and set aside. Pour remaining oil in the skillet. Add the chicken and stir-fry for 3 minutes. Return vegetables to the skillet; add the sauce mixture and nuts. Cook and stir over medium-high heat until the chicken is done and the sauce is thickened. Serve over hot rice. Makes 4 to 6 servings.
