Automatic Renewal Service - a welcome time-saver for patrons

We are always looking for ways to make it easier for you to enjoy all the resources here at Way. Automatic Renewal is a convenient new service introduced in July which makes manually renewing library materials a thing of the past. All library materials that are eligible for renewal are now renewed automatically at the end of the lending period.

Though all eligible items will be automatically renewed with no action needed by the patron, items which are not eligible for renewal will be excluded.

1,000 Books Before Kindergarten Program

Starting in the end of September, families can sign up for *1,000 Books Before Kindergarten* at Way Library! The concept is simple, but the rewards are priceless.



Read a book - any book - to your newborn, infant, toddler, or preschooler. The goal is to have read 1,000 books before your child starts kindergarten. Sounds difficult? It's just one bedtime story every night for three years, or ten books a week for two years, or twenty books a week for one year (that's just three books a day).

Register at the Youth Services Desk where you will receive a special tote bag that has everything you need to get started. Check back in at the library after reading 200, 400, 600, 800, and 1,000 books for fun prizes! Once you reach 1,000 books, you will become part of our Hall of Fame, receive a gift book, and be awarded a certificate of completion. Ramen Noodle Frittata

Ingredients:

1 package Ramen noodles
4 eggs
Salt & pepper - optional
2 Tbsp. butter

1. Prepare Ramen Noodles according to directions. Drain cooking water.
2. Combine eggs with the Ramen noodles seasoning packet and whip with a fork. Add salt and pepper, if desired.
3. Combine cooked Ramen noodles with the egg mixture. Melt butter in a saucepan. Pour noodle/egg mixture into pan. Cook over medium heat until eggs are cooked through.


