WPLFF Installs Book Nook at Mercy Health Perrysburg Cancer Center

On March 9, 2017, Way Public Library Foundation & Friends donated approximately 150 books to the Mercy Health Perrysburg Cancer Center for use by patients while they are receiving treatments. The "Book Nook" is



installed in the Infusion Waiting Room on the Center's second floor.

The collection is mostly adult fiction, but it contains nonfiction and children's/juvenile/young adult titles as well. Once a patient has finished a book it may be kept as a gift, passed along to someone else, returned to the Book Nook at the Cancer Center, or dropped off at Way Library.

Mercy Health and Way Public Library have been partners since 2012 with the goal of providing educational opportunities for families about health and wellness. Way is proud to host a monthly speakers' series featuring Mercy Health experts, as well as regular courses on managing diabetes and chronic illnesses.

Cold Shrimp Spread

12 oz. bottle Heinz chili sauce 2 Tbsp. Worcestershire sauce 8 oz. cream cheesse 2 Tbsp. Miracle Whip 1 small can tiny shrimp, drained 2 Tbsp. chopped onion Parsley flakes 1 tsp. lemon juice

- 1. Combine Worcestershire sauce, Miracle Whip, chopped onion, lemon juice, and cream cheese.
- 2. Spread cream cheese mixture on a large plate. Pour chili sauce on top. Sprinkle can of shrimp on top.
- 4. Garnish with parsley.
- 5. Chill for 2 hours. Serve with crackers of choice.

Special Walleye Fest Presentations

<u>Maumee River Lake Sturgeon Restoration Program</u> (April 26, 2017 at 2:00pm)

It is believed that only two populations of lake sturgeon remain in Lake Erie. Through physical habitat assessments done by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and project partners it is believed that the Maumee River is a suitable river for lake sturgeon restoration. Justin Chiotti, fisheries biologist, will share information and underwater video taken during those assessments. He will also discuss the historical status of lake sturgeon, reasons for their decline and the on-going restoration efforts. Co-sponsored by Historic Perrysburg, Inc.
