This recipe is from a Baylor University Homecoming cookbook published in 1994. My family requests it (and by that I mean "begs for it") on birthdays and beach vacations. -Rose Mills



### COFFEE ICE CREAM MUD PIE

Crust: 18-24 Oreo cookies (the classic ones-not the "Double-Stuf" variety) 1/3 cup butter, melted 1 tsp espresso powder

Filling: 48 oz. your favorite coffee-flavored ice cream, softened 1 8 oz. bag Heath English Toffee Bits (also known as Bits O' Brickle)

Fudge Sauce: 1 cup semi-sweet chocolate chips 1/2 cup sugar 1 cup evaporated milk Pinch of salt 1 tsp vanilla extract

For the crust, crush cookies in food processor. Mix in melted butter and espresso powder. Press mixture onto bottom and sides of a 9-inch pie pan. Chill for at least 15 minutes.

For the filling, mix together softened ice cream and toffee bits. Spoon filling into prepared crust. Freeze until firm. Cover with plastic wrap or foil and continue to freeze for at least 6 hours or overnight. For sauce, place chocolate chips, sugar, evaporated milk, and salt in a microwave-safe bowl. Microwave on high power for 2 minutes; beat with a whisk. Continue to cook in 2-minute increments, whisking well after each interval, until chocolate is melted and mixture is smooth-about 4 to 5 minutes. Stir in vanilla extract. Sauce will continue to thicken as it cools. Store in refrigerator. Reheat to serve.

To serve, remove pie from freezer about 10 minutes ahead of serving time. Cut into wedges and top with warm fudge sauce.
