

Duct Tape Zip Pouch

Duct Tape
Quart Sized Freezer Slider Bags
Scissors



2 rolls of fun printed duct tape and 2 quart-sized freezer slider bags are included in the take home craft kit.



Step 1

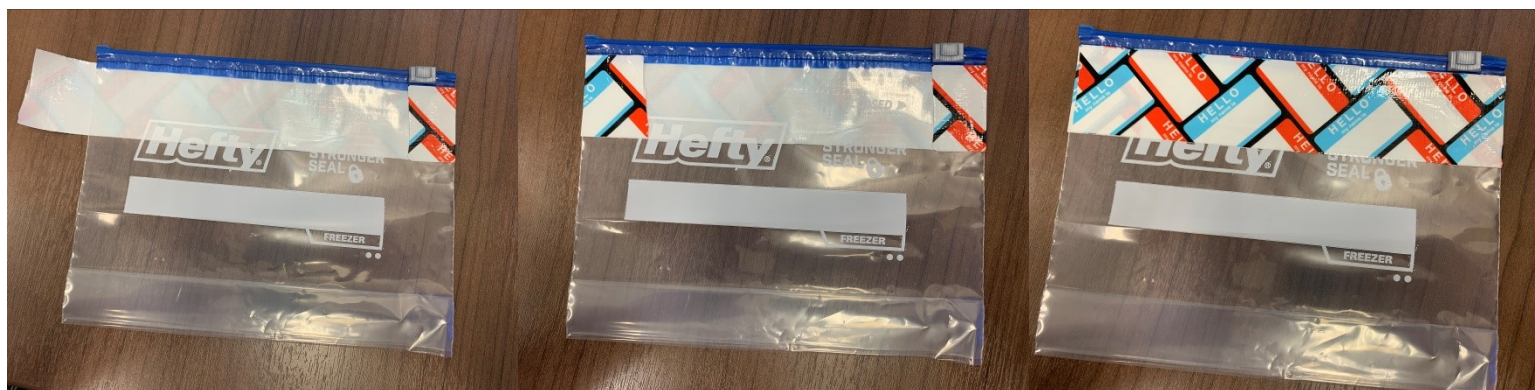
Start by cutting a piece of duct tape that's at least 2 inches longer than the width of your plastic bag. Line the tape up just under the edge of the zip top and press it down.



To cover entire bag, 2 yards of duct tape are needed. To make the shorter bag, 1 ½ yards of duct tape are needed. There are 6 yards of duct tape on each roll.

Step 2

Flip the bag over and fold over the 1 inch extra duct tape on each side of the bag. Cut another piece of tape the width of the bag to cover the back side of the bag edge to edge. Line the tape up just under the edge of the zip top and press it down.



Step 3

Continue adding rows of duct tape like in **Steps 1 and 2**, matching the design if possible.



Step 4

On the last row of duct tape, the tape will be about a 1/2 inch longer than the bag. Continue just like the other rows, by flipping the bag over and folding over the 1" overhanging sides. Cut another smaller piece of tape to cover the back side of the bag edge to edge. The 1/2 inch at the bottom will bond with the tape from the other side.



Repeat the process again to make another Duct Tape Zip Pouch! For the shorter ladybug print duct tape pouch, the bag was cut at the bottom. The ladybug print duct tape DID NOT have a pattern that could be matched like the Hello my name is... duct tape did.



These duct tape zip pouches are great for pencil cases, make-up, snacks, mask bags and more.
