

# Magnolia Leaf Book Page Wreath



## Supplies included:

- About 25 pages of a book
- Cardboard wreath
- Twine
- Scrap cardboard template

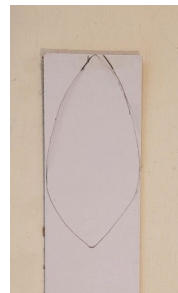
## Supplies needed:

- Pencil
- Scissors
- Craft glue or hot glue

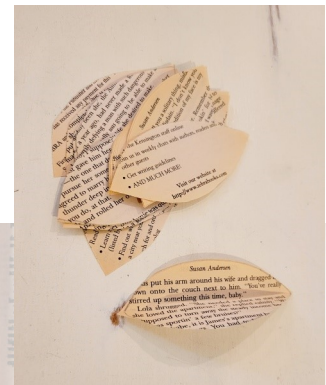
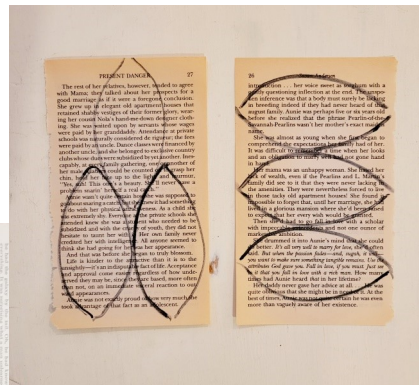
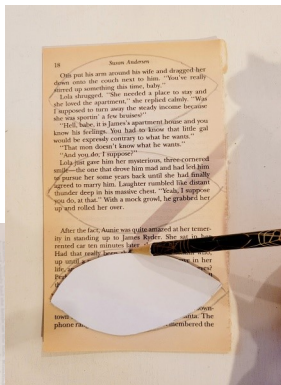
**Step One:** Slip twine through hole in the cardboard wreath and knot the twine.

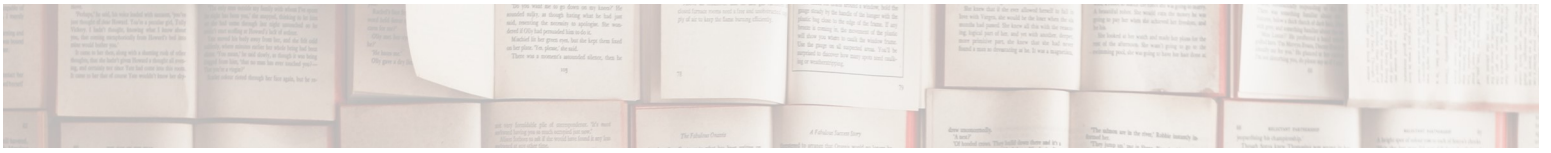


**Step Two:** Cut out leaf on cardboard scrap for template. Our leaf was approximately 4 inches long x 2 inches wide.



**Step Three:** Use the template to draw the leaf onto a stack of book pages. You should be able to fit at least three on each page. Cut them out - it's easiest to do multiple pages at a time. You will need about 45 leaves total.





**Tip:** Fold the leaf lengthwise, then again fold one end up. This will give some dimension to your wreath once it's hanging.



**Step Four:** Starting at the twine loop, apply the glue to the folded end of the leaf and add the leaves one at a time to the cardboard wreath. Stagger the leaves to give a natural look to the pattern and cover any gaps. Work counterclockwise around the wreath.



**Personalization:** Endless options with these - so many different books, music or maps to use! Depending on the significance of the paper - cut your leaves to best highlight what's on the page. Show us where you hang your fabulous creations on our Way Public Library Facebook page!
