

PAINTED ROCK FIREWORKS

Supplies included:

- One black river rock
- One natural river rock
- Paint palette
with red, white, & blue paint
- Embossing tool
with medium & small ends

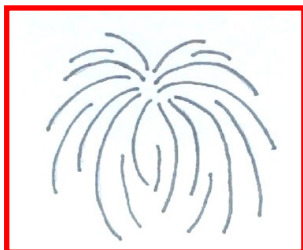
Additional supplies needed:

- Something to protect work surface
- Pencil
- Clear Spray Sealer (optional)



Step 1

Use pencil lightly draw curved lines on black river rock. Similar to the following designs.

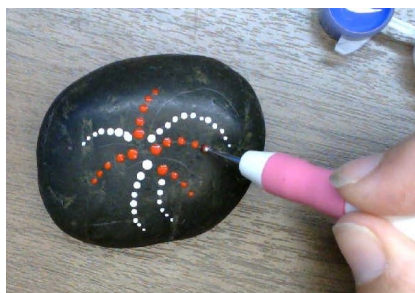
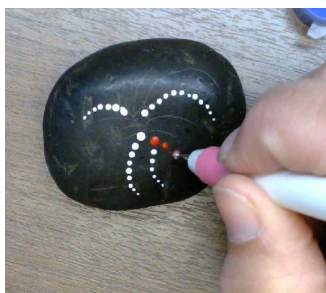
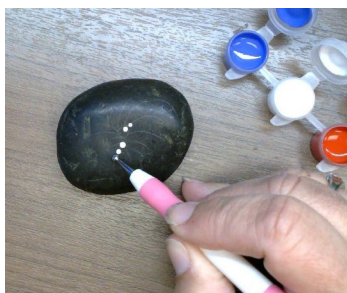


What is a dot in art? A **dot** is a **small round mark**, rather the smallest point that is usually created with any pointed instrument. In art and designing, dots are considered the basic building block of an artwork. It is the simplest element of art and drawing. Dots establish relationship with the space around it. **Pointillism** is a painting style in which a picture or a drawing is made using small colored dots. In computer and graphics, the term 'dot' is used to refer to a pixel or the 'periods' that are used in URLs and email IDs.

Step 2

Using medium end of embossing tool, dip into paint. Begin adding dots to your rock at center of firework. Use small end of embossing tool to make smaller dots as you get to edges of your firework. BE CREATIVE!!! Each of your fireworks can be a different color OR make your firework red, white, and blue!



Step 3

Allow the paint to dry, then add a coat of clear spray sealer (optional).
