Playing Card Necklace



Supplies:


Drilled Jenga block Playing card Charm Jump rings (3) Eye screw

Paint brush Mod Podge Necklace Nail file Pencil Scissors

Step One: Center the front of the Jenga block over the playing card and trace a large rectangle with a pencil. Next, trace the sides of the block onto the playing card, making two narrower rectangles. Keep in mind, it will look more like a folded playing card if you keep your rectangles with the same height on their top edges.

Step Two: Cut out the rectangles. If any pencil marks are showing, simply erase them now.

Step Three: Tip: Screwing the eye screw into the pre-drilled hole at the top of your block now will give you something to hold while applying the Mod Podge. Paint a thin layer of Mod Podge to the front and sides of the Jenga block. Press the corresponding playing card pieces onto the block. Be sure to keep them in order!







Step Four: Once dry, paint a thin layer of Mod Podge over the entire block. Seal the edges completely to prevent them from peeling up. *If you would like rough edges, use the nail file to roughen them up and give texture before sealing with Mod Podge.* Allow to dry.

Tip: If you attached the eye screw in Step Three, threading the necklace through the eye screw now allows you to hang the necklace for the Mod Podge to dry.

Step Five: Attach jump rings together, then onto the eye screw to create a chain. Add the charm to

the end. Your necklace is complete!

Personalization: The options are as boundless as the playing cards in the world! Have fun with it. You can also paint the block to coordinate with your card before step three - allow the paint to dry completely before using Mod Podge. Add more charms or jazz up the card itself! Don't forget to show us your fabulous creations!
