### Bernadine Stetzel Gallery Opening Reception



The public is invited to the opening reception of "Bernadine Stetzel, 1927-2016: A Retrospective" on December 4, 2016 from 2:00 pm-4:00 pm. This is a rare and historic exhibition featuring an overview of the life's work of Bernadine Stetzel. One of Northwest Ohio's most beloved and prolific artists, Mrs. Stetzel passed away recently at the age of 89. On public view for the first time will be select items from the private collections of family members, friends, and the large holdings owned by Library House Gallery in Grand Rapids, Ohio.

The afternoon reception will be held in the downstairs Gallery at Way Library. The extensive collection, as well as a short documentary called *Memory Paintings, the Art of Bernadine Stetzel*, will be available for viewing. Refreshments will be served.

The exhibition will be on display in the Gallery at Way Library from December 4, 2016 until February 3, 2017.

## Look Who's Cooking

Crystal McNeal, Youth Services Librarian, has submitted this month's recipe for "Look Who's Cooking." This delicious recipe is a family favorite during the holiday season when gathering with special friends and family. Hope you enjoy!



### Cinnamon Sugar Nuts

1 large egg white  
1/2 cup sugar  
1/4 cup brown sugar, packed  
2 tsp. cinnamon  
3 cups raw almonds (or other nut of choice)

1. Preheat oven to 300° F. Line a baking sheet with parchment paper; set aside.
2. In a small bowl, whisk together egg white and 1 tablespoon of water until frothy, about 2 minutes; set aside.
3. In a medium bowl, combine sugars and cinnamon; set aside.
4. In a large bowl, combine the nuts and egg white mixture until well combined. Stir in brown sugar mixture until evenly coated.
5. Spread mixture onto prepared baking sheet in an even layer. Place into oven and bake for 25-30 minutes. Let cool before serving.


