### Looks Who's Cooking...

Lisa Richard, Programming Coordinator and Way Public Library Foundation & Friends Administrator, has submitted this month's recipe for "Look Who's Cooking." This is a favorite recipe that Lisa likes to make for her family and for special events. The salad is tasty and crisp, and a little lighter in calories than the traditional broccoli salad. Yum! Hope you enjoy!



#### Light Broccoli Salad

4 cups broccoli  
1-1/2 cups seedless green grapes, cut in half  
1 cup chopped celery  
1 cup raisins  
1/4 cup salted sunflower seed kernels  
1/3 cup light mayonnaise  
1/4 cup plain fat-free yogurt  
3 tablespoons sugar  
1 tablespoon white vinegar

Combine first 5 ingredients in large bowl. Combine mayonnaise and remaining dressing ingredients. Stir with a whisk. Pour over broccoli mixture and toss well. Chill for 1 hour.
