Not only is this a presidential primary, but Way Library's replacement operating levy is on the ballot.

Way Library on Ballot March 17, 2020

The Way Library Board of Trustees has voted to place a 1.9 mill replacement levy on the ballot on March 17, 2020. This will be a fouryear replacement of the current 1.9 mill operating levy.



Passage of this replacement levy will allow us to:

- Preserve our budget for books, digital materials, and other circulating items.
- Continue to provide free programs and events. In 2019, Way offered more than 1,000 programs for children, teens, and adults.
- Meet the current and emerging technology and training needs of our patrons.
- Provide support to satisfy the community's increasing need of our meeting room spaces. Usage has more than doubled in the past five years.
- Maintain the safety and integrity of our heavily used facility. Funds for repairs, maintenance, cleaning, and service agreements are critical to protect the public's investment.

The basic facts about the levy:

- This is a four-year replacement of the current 1.9 mill operating levy.
- The current 1.9 mill operating levy, which represents over half of our budget, expires at the end of 2020.
- The cost of the 1.9 mill replacement levy for the owner of a \$200,000 home will be \$11.08 per month.

Way Library is widely recognized as a great library. It is a highly visible, heavily used community gathering place. Without the local funding which represents more than half of our budget, the Library's ability to provide core services would be severely impacted.

Our Library is a source of much pride for the citizens of Perrysburg. We consider it a privilege to provide excellent library services and resources which enrich lives and add value to the community. The passage of the replacement levy is necessary to protect the Library's current services and to support the vital role it plays in the community.

Express Collection

Have you noticed books and other items with an "Express" label?

Way Library's Express Collection makes it possible for you to check out a hot, new bestseller or popular film with no waiting.



Express copies are offered for many current bestselling books and books on CD, as well as the most popular films and television shows recently released on DVD. These Express copies of high-demand items are available on a **first come, first served basis**.

The Express label (with the colorful train engine pictured above) indicates the item may not be reserved and may not be renewed. It may have a shorter loan period than other copies; for example, 14 days instead of four weeks.

When an Express item is returned, it is placed back on the shelf immediately after it is checked in. It's a good idea to check the Express section regularly, especially if you have a hold on a very popular item. You may actually find an Express copy to check out with no waiting! Express items are located in the browsing aisle. Be sure to ask at the Information Desk if you need help finding them.
