Chicken Lettuce Wraps

- 1 package Sun-Bird Chicken Lettuce Wrap Seasoning Mix 1/4 cup water
- 1 Tbsp. soy sauce
- $1 \frac{1}{2}$ tsp. sugar
- 1 1/2 lbs. ground chicken



2/3 cup water chestnuts, drained and diced

1/3 cup sliced green onions

2/3 cup diced mushrooms

1 head iceberg lettuce

Cooked white or brown rice

1. In a 2-quart glass bowl, combine seasoning packet, water, soy sauce, and sugar. Stir in ground chicken, water chestnuts, green onions, and mushrooms. Cover and refrigerate for 20 minutes. Stir once.

2. In a large skillet, sauté chicken marinade mixture on high for 1 minute. Reduce heat to medium and cook for 7 additional minutes, stirring occasionally. Remove from heat and keep warm.

3. Cut head of iceberg lettuce in half and wash and drain well. Separate whole lettuce leaves.

4. Fill lettuce leaf with cooked rice and chicken mixture.


