

September Spice of the Month: Star Anise

Star anise contains a chemical compound, shikimic acid, that is used in making one of the world's most used anti-influenza drugs, Tamiflu (oseltamivir). The process of extracting shikimic acid from star anise seeds has 10 stages and takes a year to complete; severe flu epidemics may cause star anise shortages.




