SPICE OF THE MONTH

Poppy Seeds

Not only are poppy seeds a versatile ingredient in cooking and baking, but they are also a nutritionally dense little seed. Poppy seeds are rich in fiber, essential omega-6 fatty acids, calcium, magnesium, manganese, phosphorus, thiamin, folate, and zinc.

Morse Code is a method used in telecommunications to encode text characters as standardized sequences of two different signal durations, called *dots* and *dashes*. May's

Dr. Kristen Geaman, Associate Lecturer in History at the University of Toledo, will lead a book discussion on *The Once and Future Witches*. Books will be available at the library for checkout. Dr. Geaman is a native of Findlay, Ohio,



who completed her undergraduate work at the University of Delaware and her graduate work at the University of Southern California. Her research focuses on infertility in late medieval England, especially how couples coped with their childlessness after spiritual and medical remedies failed. She is currently finishing a biography of Anne of Bohemia, Queen of England. She regularly teaches a course on Witchcraft and Magic in medieval and early modern Europe. *LTAI: Women's Suffrage is a humanities discussion project from the American Library Association (ALA) supported by the National Endowment for the Humanities (NEH).*

When it comes to a stroke, seconds matter. Strokes are the fourth leading cause of death in the United States, but acting early can improve chances of survival. Join **Julie Goins-Whitmore**, **RN**, **MBA**, as she shares tips on recognizing stroke warning signs and symptoms, so you can respond quickly in case of an emergency.

Julie is the program manager for the Mercy Health – Neuroscience Institute, serving the Toledo community with Mobile Stroke Unit and Telemedicine services. In the past, she served as a critical care transport nurse with the Life Flight Network. She received her Nursing Diploma from Mercy Health – St. Vincent School of Nursing, and her bachelor's degree in Health Care Administration from Mercy College of Ohio. She also earned her master's degree in Business Administration from Bowling Green State University. Julie is certified in four types of life support, including advanced trauma and emergency neurological, and is NIH stroke scale certified. She also has extensive research and lecture experience with neuroscience and stroke care topics.


Northern France and WWI & WWII Monday, June 6, 2 pm


