
Celebrate with us!

Free COVID-19 Rapid Test Kits

Way Library is offering rapid at-home COVID-19 tests upon request. Tests are being made available by the Ohio Department of Health at no cost to patrons or the library.

Kits may be picked up at the Circulation Desk or via curbside delivery.

The test provides results in minutes and detects the virus in the early part of the disease when people are most infectious. It is used with an online service, provided by eMed, which helps guide people through the testing process.

The 15-minute test, coupled with the required NAVICA app, gives proof of a valid test result for those who need an immediate verified pass for work, school, or travel. It is completely free of charge.

The test is designed to be taken at home and is not intended to be administered at or by the library.


