Thanks to funding from Way Public Library Foundation & Friends, Dr. Ryan Ebright has joined us as Musicologist-in-Residence this fall. Dr. Ebright is Assistant Professor of Musicology at BGSU.

A musicologist is someone who studies music from an academic or scholarly perspective. As our Musicologist-in-Residence, Dr. Ebright will share his expertise in music with the community by presenting programs and holding office hours at the library.





During office hours, you are welcome to drop in with a piece of music or a writing project to discuss. You can also ask Dr. Ebright questions about higher education, performance, public speaking, writing, research/writing history, and anything music-related.

A Presidential Appearance

October 12, 2019 is the 35th anniversary of President Ronald Reagan's whistle stop train visit to Perrysburg. The "Heartland Express" stopped just east of Louisiana Avenue and a crowd of 20,000 people gathered to get a glimpse of the President. Reagan made a 20-minute speech from the rear platform of the train car, the historic *Ferdinand Magellan*, which both FDR and Truman had used during their presidencies. Perrysburg's population at the time of Reagan's visit in 1984 was 11,000. Now? 27,000!
