

Way Library on Ballot March 15, 2016

An important message from the Director



The Way Library Board of Trustees has voted to place a levy on the ballot on March 15, 2016. This will be a four-year renewal of the 1.5 mill operating levy with an additional .4 mill.

Way Public Library is widely recognized as a great library. It is a highly-visible, heavily used community gathering place. Without the local funding which represents half of our budget, the Library's ability to provide sought-after services would be severely restricted.

Our library is a source of great pride for the citizens of Perrysburg. We consider it a privilege to provide excellent library services and resources which enrich lives and add value to the community. The passage of this levy is necessary to protect the Library's current services and to support the vital role it plays in the community.

AARP Free Tax Service

Local AARP Tax-Aide volunteers have returned to Way Public Library to assist seniors and moderate to low income families file their taxes. AARP Tax-Aide volunteers will begin preparing



2015 Federal, Ohio, and School District tax returns starting February 1, 2016 at Way Library.

Appointments should be made by contacting the tax-preparation site (the Way Library Computer Lab) at 419-874-3135 ext. 136. The site will be open Mondays and Wednesdays, 9:00am to 2:30pm, and Tuesdays and Thursdays, 11:00am to 4:30pm. The service is provided from February 1, 2016 through April 7, 2016.

Complex tax issues including depreciation, lengthy schedule Ds, casualty losses, complex K-1s, farm income, employee business expenses over \$5,000, and military returns are beyond the scope of this service.

Earned Income Credits, Child Tax Credits, Unemployment Benefits, Child and Dependent Care Expenses, Education Credits, IRA Contributions, Capital Gains/Losses, Disability Income and the Affordable Care Act (ACA) are all within the scope of this service.

All entrants are required to live in the city of Perrysburg, Perrysburg Township or the Perrysburg School District. Those who work in the city of Perrysburg are also eligible. Each entrant will receive an official "Bicentennial Battle of the Beards" badge declaring them a formal contestant in the Perrysburg Bicentennial Beard Contest.

Beards will be put on the judging block Thursday, July 7, 2016 at 7:00 p.m. on the Commodore grounds to coincide with the weekly Farmers Market and Music at the Market that evening. There will a group of local celebrity judges, which will include several professional hair specialists. Contestants must be present for judging.

Ritz Broccoli Casserole by Kara Prielipp

Kara Prielipp, Technology Specialist/Librarian, has submitted this month's recipe for "Look Who's Cooking." Kara's late Grandma Prielipp would make this dish for family holidays because it is one

both kids and adults enjoy. Grandma would give each family member a can of Coke and a sloppy joe alongside this dish. But these days, Kara often pairs this with a baked chicken breast and a glass of milk. Hope you enjoy!



Ritz Broccoli Casserole

- 3 - 10 oz. packages of frozen chopped broccoli, thawed
 - 12 oz. Velveeta cheese, cut in ½ inch cubes
 - 36 Ritz crackers, coarsely crushed (about 1 ½ cups), divided
 - ¼ cup butter or margarine, melted
1. Heat oven to 350° F.
 2. Mix broccoli, Velveeta, and half of the cracker crumbs until well blended.
 3. Spoon into a 2-qt. greased baking dish. Mix the remaining cracker crumbs and butter; sprinkle over the broccoli mixture.
 4. Bake 45 minutes or until heated through.




