### We Need Your Help!

The entrance to your library is a busy place. We appreciate that some of you may feel the need to stop your vehicle in



front of the building. Some might do this to allow passengers to enter their vehicle. Others may want to make a quick run to the AV drop box connected directly to the building.

Unfortunately, stopping in the entrance lane of our parking lot causes a lot of frustration for other library users. It blocks the lane so that it is difficult to maneuver through the rest of the parking lot. It also blocks access to book drops. Most importantly, if someone parks directly in front of the building they are most likely blocking all or part of our ADA access to the building.

Please help us make the building accessible by parking in a designated place while visiting the Library. We genuinely appreciate your attention to this small request.

#### **Way Launches New Websites**

### "Responsive" Design Allows Better Mobile Use

In 2014, mobile web surfing overtook desktop surfing for the first time. People were much more likely to be viewing their favorite websites using a phone or tablet than a desktop PC. With no indications that this trend will stop anytime soon, Way recently launched new websites for its main site, children's site, and teen site. Our new websites were designed with the intention to allow for easier access while using a mobile browser like you might find on a phone or tablet. These new websites do not affect our Online Catalog.

We've moved some links around but nearly all the information that used to be on those sites still exists. You can still fill out forms for a <a href="mailto:new library card">new library card</a>, <a href="mailto:reserve a">reserve a</a> <a href="mailto:meeting room">meeting room</a>, access our <a href="mailto:catalog">catalog</a>, or <a href="print wirelessly">print wirelessly</a> from your phone or tablet. You can also get an <a href="mailto:up-to-date list">up-to-date list</a> <a href="mailto:of-programs">of-programs</a> there, although it is no longer on the front page.

If you have an aged computer, you may experience some issues with the new menu system. Specifically, Internet

Explorer 8 and lower versions do not work. As the IE8 browser is nine years old, please consider updating your computer using <u>Windows Update</u> or trying a different browser like <u>Google Chrome</u> or <u>Mozilla Firefox</u>. If you are still using Internet Explorer 8, you may be pleasantly surprised how fast the web will function with a newer, **free** browser!
