

Spring concerts to feature international music

Way Library will echo with the sounds of beautiful music this spring, beginning with a return visit by the talented Bessmeltseva sisters. On Sunday, **March 13**, at 2 p.m., this violinist-pianist duo will perform Russian-French-German folk tunes and recognizable classical music from Hungary, Romania, Argentina and Poland.

These award winning musicians are violinist Maria Bessmeltseva, who will complete her doctorate in musical arts at University of Michigan in May, and her sister Ekaterina, who will receive in May a second master's degree in chamber music at the University of South Florida.

Way's next Topical Tuesday lecture will feature Dr. Celia Williamson, University of Toledo professor of social work, speaking on "Human Trafficking in Ohio," on Tuesday, March 15, at 7 p.m. Refreshments will be served.

Dr. Williamson's research into sexual trafficking and child exploitation has made her an expert on the subject.

She will discuss human trafficking worldwide, in Ohio and in the Toledo area, sharing information on the number of victims and how our community can work to end this modern-day slavery.

On Tuesday, April 26, at 7 p.m. Way and the League of Women Voters of the Perrysburg Area will host 'Food for Thought,' a panel discussion on food and nutrition. Topical Tuesday meetings always include time for discussion and questions/answers.

Two of the panelists will be Gretchen Fayerweather, chef instructor and program coordinator of the Culinary Arts and Dietetic Technician Program at Owens Community College, and Chef Bill Kolhoff from Walt Churchill's Market. The panelists will discuss food and the latest trends in nutrition and healthy eating.

The next concert in our spring series is a special "kickoff National Library Week" event to be held on Sunday, April 10, at 2 p.m. The Perrysburg Symphony Chorale (pictured at right) will travel around the world in song—from America's Shaker villages ("Tis a Gift to be Simple") to alongside longshoremen as they stow timber on the decks of two-masted schooners along the St. Lawrence in Quebec. Sail across the Atlantic to hear about Bonnie Prince Charlie's escape to the Isle of Skye. Journey through eastern Europe to hear the ancient songs of these lands. Travel to India and then hear the shanties of Kanaka seafarers en route to the sheep stations of Australia.

On Friday, **April 29**, at 7 p.m. we will wrap up our musical tour with a **Toledo Opera** Young Artist Concert. Join us for some of the world's greatest opera arias in an event made possible by the L. Paul Baldoni Fund in memory of the late Dr. Baldoni.

'Who Really Wrote the Shakespeare Plays?' Edgar Willis to speak April 14

For 150 years, the true identity of William Shakespeare has been the subject of scholarly debate. Way Library will weigh in on the subject and come up with a "final answer" when we host retired University of Michigan professor **Edgar Willis** on Thursday, April 14, at 7 p.m. As part of our celebration of National Library Week, Professor Willis will speak on "Who Really Wrote the Shakespeare Plays?" Refreshments will be served at this free event.

Chairman of U of M's Speech, Communication and Theater Department for 10 years, Professor Willis has seen all 37 plays, acted in several of them, and for many years led discussion sessions during the annual Michigan Alumni trips to the Shakespeare Festival in Stratford, Ontario.

Mark Twain, Nathaniel Hawthorne and Sigmund Freud are among those who have doubted the identity of Shakespeare. Was the author of the plays actually Christopher Marlowe, the 17th Earl of Oxford, Francis Bacon, perhaps even Queen Elizabeth? Hear Professor Willis's conclusions...and form your own!


