NANCY KELLEY FETED AS OHIO LIBRARIAN OF THE YEAR

Way Library Director Nancy J. Kelley was honored as 2007 Ohio Librarian of the Year, at the Ohio Library Council Expo/Convention in Columbus on October 12 and at a public reception at Way Library on October 21.

Mrs. Kelley was a keynote speaker at the awards luncheon held during the annual convention of the Ohio Library Council.

On October 21, the Friends of Way Library hosted a public reception in the café area of the library. Way board president Elaine Bishop introduced Mrs. Kelley, who spoke briefly. The Way staff presented a gift book in honor of this distinction. State Senator Randy Gardner presented a proclamation on behalf of the Ohio General Assembly. Perrysburg Mayor Nelson Evans pointed to the importance of Way Library as a community hub which offers educational and cultural events for people of all ages.

Author Wil Clay, book sale, veterans' taping on Nov. 10

Way Library will join in Perrysburg's annual kickoff to the holidays on Saturday, November 10, with a book sale, taping of veterans' war stories, and a visit by children's author/illustrator Wil Clay.

The Friends of Way Library book sale will be held from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. on the lower level of the library.

In conjunction with the "Stars and Stripes" theme for the annual Holiday Parade, Way local history librarian Richard Baranowski will join Bud Fisher of the Library of Congress veterans' project in **videotaping** recollections of veterans here at the library from 9 a.m.—3 p.m.

Anyone who wishes to share their recollections of military service may schedule a time with Mr. Baranowski, 419-874-3135x110. A copy of each story will be given to the veteran's family as a keepsake. A copy also will be archived in the Way local history room and another will be sent to the U.S. Library of Congress as part of the UT veterans' project.

In the afternoon, **Wil Clay**, award-winning author/illustrator of children's books, will be a special guest in a program co-sponsored by local art group **Prizm Creative Community**. Mr. Clay will begin at 1:30 p.m. with a talk to children. **~Continued on page 2>>**

Known for his entertaining and motivating speaking style, Mr. Clay will talk to the children about the importance of reading, writing and art. He will draw the audience into his imaginative world while demonstrating his skill at the easel. At 2:40 p.m., he will sign books. At 3:15 p.m. he will speak to adults on the art of illustration.

At 4:30 p.m. the annual Holiday Parade will begin, followed by open houses in the shops of downtown Perrysburg and the official tree-lighting ceremony at Hood Park.

Way Library and Prizm are pleased that Mr. Clay has put together this program to help us usher in the holiday season in Perrysburg. Mr. Clay is currently working on illustrations for "Songs of Freedom," a 32-page story book about a little girl who travels the Underground Railroad with her parents. The book will come with a DVD, including a choir singing historical songs and spirituals and footage of Mr. Clay drawing the girl as she encounters difficulties along the way. The artist, who now lives in North Carolina, frequently returns to his Toledo home to work on a mural at the Mott Branch Library. Commissioned by the Toledo-Lucas County Public Library, Mr. Clay is creating a very large, six-section art work depicting children in a library setting.

America's democracy consists of three branches of government: the executive, the legislative, and the
