### NANCY J. KELLEY TO RETIRE AS WAY DIRECTOR

Nancy J. Kelley, Way Library Director since 1991, is retiring on August 31 after 33 years of library service. Join us at the library to honor Mrs. Kelley at a retirement



reception Sunday, August 29, 2 to 4 p.m.

Mrs. Kelley has led the library to recognition as one of the top 100 libraries in the nation. Ranked sixth out of 1,764 libraries in our size category by the Hennen library rating system, Way also received the highest, 5-star ranking in 2009 when Library Journal initiated its national library rating system. With Mrs. Kelley at the helm, the library was renovated and expanded in 2001 and successfully passed and then renewed an operating levy in 2004 and 2008.

Honored as Ohio Librarian of the Year in 2007, Mrs. Kelley is highly regarded by her peers in the library world as well as Way's staff, patrons, and members of the Perrysburg community.

Mrs. Kelley plans to volunteer as facilitator of Way's popular Wednesday morning book discussion and Friday evening foreign/art film series. She will continue her work as a Toledo Museum of Art docent and hopes to travel and spend more time with husband Ed and their extended family. ### Way board of trustees appoints Janel Haas as director

At its meeting on Thursday, July 22, the Way Public Library Board of Trustees voted unanimously to appoint Janel Haas new director of Way Library, effective September 1, 2010.

Mrs. Haas has been employed at Way since July 1989. After serving as head of technical services from 1997 to 2004, she was named assistant director in 2004. As Director Nancy Kelley's assistant, she helped to oversee the daily operations of the library, supervised and administered various library programs, and represented northwest Ohio on the Ohio Library Council's Action Council.

Mrs. Haas has a bachelor of arts degree in psychology from Lourdes College and a master of library and information science degree from Kent State University. She is currently president of the executive board of Prevention Partners and a board member of Behavioral Con-

The library's Topical Tuesday series re-opens this fall with the timely topic of peace. On Tuesday, September 21, at 7 p.m. Sr. Sharon Havelak, MA and member of the Sisters of Saint Francis, Sylvania, will speak on **peace** in our world. Refreshments will be served at this free event.

Sr. Havelak provides stunning statistics on the human and economic cost of the recent wars in Iraq and Afghanistan. Between 2003 and 2005, the United States' military expenditures (\$450 billion) totaled almost as much as the rest of the world's countries combined. What can be done to end war and its tragic legacy?

On Tuesday, October 19, at 7 p.m., Julia Nielsen Bingman of the Ohio Consumers for Health Care Coverage will conduct a community forum on the new **health care legislation**. In partnership with the League of Women Voters of the Perrysburg Area, the library is pleased to present this opportunity to learn about recent federal health care reform and to ask questions and express concern about its impact upon Ohio and other states.

Way Library believes in the three R's of responsible environmental stewardship: reduce, reuse and recycle.

Reduce — The Way staff continues to substitute electronic rather than paper notifications whenever possible.

Reuse — Our AV department uses new cases for books on CD which are made of long lasting recycled materials. Youth Services uses discarded DVD and CD cases for craft projects.

Recycle — Patrons can drop off old CDs, DVDs, and videos in the recycling bin in the library lobby. After the recent tornados in northwest Ohio, we donated five used computers and monitors to the United Way for disaster assistance to home owners affected by the storm.
